## **MA in Applied Linguistics**

This full time one-year course will appeal to a wide range of students, including present and future language teachers and those interested in linguistics, language studies and communication.

Those applying for the course should have, or expect to have by the month of August prior to starting the course, a BA degree (Second Class Honours, Grade 1) in a language subject, or acceptable equivalent (significant background knowledge and/or considerable work experience).

#### Applications

Applications are made on-line at www.pac.ie from December before the year in which application is sought.

#### Programme of Study:

The programme begins in September and ends in April. The programme involves attendance at lectures and seminars, the writing of course papers and the completion of other assessed tasks. Marks from this work count towards the final results.

Students prepare their dissertation of between 15,000 and 20,000 words. The dissertation is submitted in September.

Students take the following four modules:

#### AL6010: Research Dissertation

Defining a research project under the direction of staff, exploring a specialised area within the general field of Applied Linguistics, applying appropriate research methodology and presenting results in a dissertation of between 15,000 and 20,000 words.

#### AL6011: Linguistic Theory

General Introduction to Phonetics and Phonology as well as to Morphology and Syntax.

#### • AL6012: Applied Linguistics

Focus on selected fields of Applied Linguistics such as Pragmatics and Semantics, Sociolinguistics and Second Language Acquisition.

#### AL6013 Areas of Specialisation in Applied Linguistics

The range of areas on offer is subject to staff availability and may include an emphasis on: Second Language

Acquisition, Holistic Concepts of Language Teaching and Learning, Language and Identity, Translation and Self-Translation, Language Teaching and Post-Colonialism.

Additionally, students are also introduced to various areas within Research Methods such as web and library resources, reference managing software, study design and data collection, writing a literature review, publishing, editing and reviewing.
